Lyttelton Master Plan Revealed

When you read this, Lyttelton residents should have received a copy of the Summary Plan and a submission form. The Lyttelton community has from November 19th to December 19th to make any submissions on the Lyttelton Master Plan.

Please take the time to read all the information. If you need to see more detailed copies of the Plan they are available at a variety of venues both in the town and around the Harbour. Several hard copies are available for viewing at the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre. Feel free to come in to read them and ask whatever questions you have. Ask your elected representatives as well. The Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board will be hosting their next drop in evening at the library at 5pm Thursday December 8th.

Drop in sessions will be held at the Recreation Centre Wednesday Dec 7th 1.30pm to 6pm and Saturday Dec 10th 10am to 4pm. At these sessions you will also find local representatives from the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre, Lyttelton Harbour Business Association, Project Lyttelton and the Lyttelton Community Association. These community groups will be there to assist you with the process alongside council staff. Keep an eye out for information panels on London Street.

When you are ready to submit your

comments on the Lyttelton Master Plan you can go online to the Council web site and submit directly to the council; via email to LytteltonMP@ccc.govt.nz; hand in at the drop in sessions or to council service centres; or post. All the details are on the submissions forms.

Your local community groups have ensured that there is as much information available to you as possible and in as many forms as possible. Keep an eye on the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre website as we will load a blank copy of the submission form, and create a template with our suggested answers to questions. You are welcome to use the template in whatever form you like.

Please note that in the submission pack you have received there is a typing error on page three. Under the section “What we would like you to do”, your thoughts are invited until 5pm December 19th not November 19th as printed.

More Concerns Raised

The Lyttelton Review article on the fate of the Macbeth roof last week drew lots of interest.

The stage has subsequently come down and we are hoping that another community group from the harbour basin will purchase it. If that is the final outcome that will in deed be a win win for the area. We will keep you posted.

Further interest and offers of help were received from the media, CERA, the Mayor's office and a possible donor. The stage roof highlighted just another problem in the recovery process for Lyttelton.

Subsequently a few of us submitted some recovery items of concern to the CERA Community Forum representatives in a bid to move things forward.

The Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre compiled a similar list and forwarded it to other relevant people within CERA.

Things of interest were lack of progress in opening key businesses and community facilities within the township, difficulties with re-location of the Farmers Market, and so forth.

Our concerns have been acknowledged and we are hopeful that there will be some positive outcomes soon.

Summer Comes to Lyttelton

Lyttelton IS Open for Business

For the first time in many months, there was a feel of summer in the air in Lyttelton this weekend. The Farmers Market, open from 10.00am until 1.00pm every Saturday morning, was buzzing with local people and visitors alike making their choice of a wide variety of locally grown fresh produce, all of the tables outside Coffee Culture were full with people enjoying coffee whilst taking in the hustle and bustle of London Street, where people were walking along eating ice creams from the London Street Dairy. Of course there is a choice of two other coffee shops – Dave’s Place just beside Portico on London Street, or Samo on Canterbury Street opposite the Loons.

Down at the Fishermans Wharf there is the opportunity to sit in one of two sun-drenched outdoor areas and enjoy a glass of wine and delicious food, and outside the pop-up Lyttelton Bakery there is al fresco seating – both options of course have excellent views of Harbour and all its activity.

Whilst the Lyttelton swimming pool unfortunately remains closed, many people have already taken the opportunity to take a dip at Corsair Bay – the harbour water has been declared safe for swimming – and the walking tracks from Lyttelton to Corsair Bay, and Cass Bay beyond, are open. So even though the Bridle path and the hill tracks remain closed, the tracks round to the bays afford both easy walking and excellent water views. And if you want to be a little more adventurous, all of the walking tracks at Diamond Harbour and Mt Herbert are open, all easily accessed from the Diamond Harbour Ferry, which is operating as normal and interchanges easily with the number 28 Metro bus.

Or of course you could have a game of Petanque (or just a seat in the sun) at the Lyttelton Petanque Club, an initiative of Gapfiller, the Harbour Arts Collective and the Lyttelton community, on the site of the old Ground deli.

And while we’re on the subject of Ground, did you know their great food and service is now available at their new home the Naval Point Yacht Club? You could even drop in on your walk to or from the bays.

After all that activity, feel free to have another coffee at one of our great outlets or grab another ice cream or drink from the Dairy, or fish & chips (choice of two shops) – and if you’re in the sun don’t forget to “slip, slop, slap” – sun protection available from Bells Pharmacy.

We may not have it all, but we have everything you need for a great summer here in Lyttelton.

As a result of the reduced capacity at the Lyttelton Main School, and the unfortunate circumstances surrounding the proposed relocation to the Lyttelton Port Company car park, the Farmers Market is desperate to trial new ways of using the school grounds to avoid losing too many vendors, and to keep the market going.

Over the past few weeks several meetings amongst vendors and the Farmers Market team have taken place and last weekend visitors to the market would have noticed a change in layout. This is all part of an experiment to use the site more effectively, by both removing non essential vehicles off site and reconfiguring the locations of the market vendors. Our market vendors have been extremely supportive in adopting these changes, with some vendors offering to share space under their gazebo so that more vendors can return to the market.

Unfortunately, even with all the best intentions, some seasonal vendors will not be able to return to the market, and new vendors who wish to be a part of the farmers market are now creating quite an extensive waiting list. The team of volunteers who work tirelessly each week to ensure the Farmers Market opens every Saturday wish to express their thanks to Lyttelton Residents for continuing to support the market while it works through these challenging times.

Jenny is keen to embrace the possibilities as to how the Tin Palace might develop, and in the meantime is relishing the fact that she can give something to the community, and says “the subsequent process of opening a gallery contributes immensely to our uniqueness and to Lyttelton's growth and redevelopment. The artists we are proud to showcase go forward into the next phase of Lyttelton's history and are decisively unique in their own personal visions and means of expression”.

Shoots of Hope

Roots Launches in Lyttelton

It's great how creative people are to get new business ventures under way. Recently the Lyttelton Review spoke with Christy Martin and Giulio Sturla who are opening up a new home business called "Roots". Giulio a trained chef moved to Christchurch with his partner Christy to work with Jonny Schwass at his former restaurant in Phillipstown.

Looking for new opportunities Giulio and Christy, who have a passion for local food, thought now was a great time to begin this home based business. Focusing on local food parties (breakfast, lunch, tapas, and dinner), catering, pop-up supper clubs, and cooking classes they hope to attract residents from far and wide to share their passion.

The aim of this business is to use local products, support the local community and be locally based. Giulio and Christy both said they just want people to "eat good food". Giulio originally from Chile was used to eating only from the pantry. "At home they used to say they lived from their "sustainable pantries"" he said. There was no fast food, everything came from home. Giulio really wants to show people that they can live like that here.

"In Lyttelton we are really lucky that we have so many good food sources right on our doorstep" he said. To support their passion of local food they buy many of their ingredients from the Lyttelton Farmers Market. Favourite suppliers are Gruff Junction - goats cheeses, Westwood Chicken, Vics Bread, Cam Booker at Grown and Real Fresh Fish. To supplement these they also purchase from Lyttel Piko and their own organic vegetable garden. This is Christy's passion as she tends the garden and grows all sorts of things.

Giulio then talks about all the wild foods in Lyttelton that many of us probably never think about. He harvests all sorts of things from around here. Parsley, flowers, chickweed, wild peas, minors lettuce, fennel, wild onions, dandelions and plantains. Just to try some of these things would be a new experience for many.

It was so interesting hearing them both talk about their travels as "road trips of food". A trip to Akaroa recently saw them find pine nuts, elderflower, wild kale etc just along the road side.

Giulio and Christy's passion for food flowed through the conversation. If you love food and are looking for a new experience Giulio and Christy's kitchen is the place to head. They can cater for you at home or at their place. Similarly they also offer food classes. If you want to know about authentic South American food this is the kitchen to head for. No food challenge is too hard for them.

Members of the Lyttelton Harbour Information Centre and Project Lyttelton have personally enjoyed a dining experience with Giulio and Christy, and can highly recommend this venture as a great food experience. 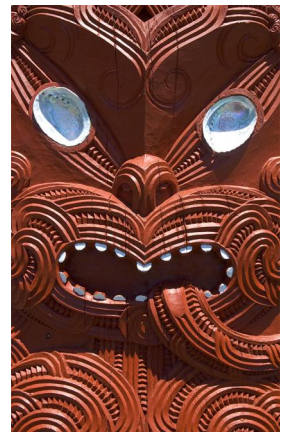

How we manage water is a key factor influencing our quality of life and prosperity both now and for future generations. The Banks Peninsula Zone Committee was set up under the Canterbury Water Management Strategy and had its launch in September.

The committee consists of five community members, four Rūnanga representatives, and appointees from Environment Canterbury and Christchurch City Council. The committee is charged with working with the community to develop a programme of recommendations on how to sustainably manage the zone's water resource for future generations. The committee is holding a series of public meetings to give the community a chance to meet the committee and provide feedback on water issues in the zone.

Torpedo Boat Museum

Volunteer to Keep the Museum Open

Housed in the category one, 1874 powder magazine building at Magazine Bay, this museum primarily exhibits the remains of Thornycroft torpedo boat. Thanks to local volunteer efforts over the past two decades the museum displays historic photographs of the vessel, her crew, exercises and shows graphics of how the spar operated. The 1999 recovery of the Torpedo boat its subsequent restoration as well as the general history of Magazine Bay as a military reserve are also covered.

As one of the few historic icons remaining after the earthquakes, the museum is set to become a destination tourism spot over the coming summer months. Unfortunately the volunteer force for this museum is struggling to keep the museum open for more than two part days per week.

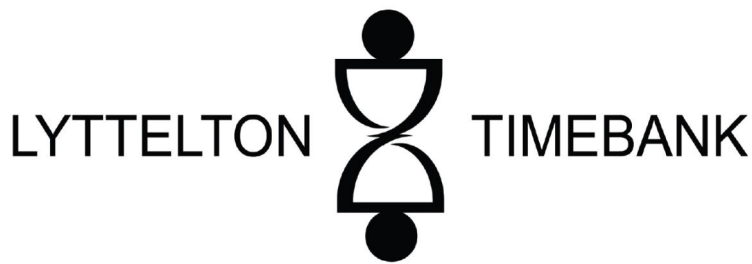

What is Time Banking?

Time Banking is a way of trading skills in a community. It uses time, rather than money, as the measurement tool. Members of a Time Bank share their skills with other members within the community and are given time credits for the work they do. With the credits they gain, each member can 'buy' someone else's time, and get the service they need.

Why Join Lyttelton Time Bank?

Time Banking adds a richness to Time Bankers' lives. As a concept it brings 'wealth', in the form of friendship, caring for one another, having our needs met from within our own community and getting help with things we can't do. Skills that are often taken for granted are valued - especially non-market economy skills - like mothering, basic home help and caring, friendliness, listening.

In Lyttelton as a result of the Time Bank we can see a tighter community forming. Friendships are forming between people of different backgrounds who would not usually have met. The elderly are being cared for and the skills they share are valued. Special needs people are encouraged to participate. Time Banking builds relationships and trust in a community. Everyone has something they can contribute to the wellbeing of the whole.

Everyone's Time is Equal

With Time Banking everybody's time is equal, no matter what type of work is done. 1 = 1. If you give one hour's work, you receive one hour time credit. If you have another member do one hour's work, they are paid one hour time credit. Every person is equally valued.

Here are a few examples of what Lyttelton Harbour residents are giving and receiving this week - can you help?



I have 2 bags of coal. I now have a heat pump and don't need it. You can have it if you take it away. - says May



I have a friend who is coming down from Auckland to train for the Coast to Coast, from mid Dec to the end of February. I am able to put him up for some of the time but he would be keen to do some house sitting over that period. He is very reliable, house trained and happy to keep your plants watered/clear your mail. Both short and long term options considered between these dates. - says Elise



I want to build a solar generator and am getting confused about amps, volts and how much I need to power what I want to. Can you help? - says Lisa



We would love some help with the school garden on an ongoing basis. A couple of hours per week would be fabulous! - says Lyttelton West School
