Porthole Container Bar

The Best Recycling Example

Over the last few months there has been lots of activity on the site of the Volcano cafe on the corner of London Street and Canterbury Street. Three containers are being converted into a new bar called Porthole and it is hoped the bar will be open before Christmas.

The bar has been designed using three shipping containers, which are placed in a U shape with a covered deck space in between. Many will note the port holes now welded into the side of the containers, giving the Porthole a very Lyttelton inspired name.

Porthole is owned by local, Mike Dunlay and his business partner, Chris Stead. Mike, who has previously owned a bar in Christchurch, says, “I saw an opportunity to create the sort of bar that suits the quiriness of Lyttelton and the current times. I had been trying to find a venue to meet this need for months and when Pete and Lois agreed to us putting a temporary building on their site it was a perfect solution. Red tape and other obstacles have prevented us from moving quicker, but we now have the end in sight and hope to have the bar open before Christmas.”

The Porthole will sell antipasto platters, designed to share with friends, and will serve local craft beers, reflecting Mike’s love of real ales, a traditional hand-pulled beer, as well as favourite lines of wines, beers and spirits. Food will be provided by the Volcano’s commercial kitchen in Lyttelton.

There has been a proposal to build a small short term off road bike track in our town. It is called a Pump Track for kids of all sizes and abilities to play on bikes. The land initially proposed has now become unavailable, but without a pool or recreation centre there is a call for more activities.

The land requirement is for a relatively flat section, not too large, 20m x 40m or bigger would work. Ideally in a highly visible location say on a street corner in the central town area. The dirt used to create the track can be taken away with a couple of hours with a loader, there are no excavations or other disturbance to the land required.

The goal is to encourage people back on bikes, have fun, be healthily, learn some skills and go on to ride more often. It's to provide a low cost [for kids] free recreational opportunity. Ideal Pump Track sites are those located in safe environments where the natural guardians of the passing community make it safe for all - say on land on a busy street, not hidden out of sight and where the visibility is high, both ways.

A Pump Track is basically a mini BMX track on a bare section level; we can build in 8-10 hours remove in one to two hours; no excavations or construction or building work; low capital, clay or dirt, maybe a base of liquefaction material; low maintenance, possibly some drain flow pipe; safety planning by design via Police Education Officers

We Have: the plans; experienced MTB and BMX track builders ; support from Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community board; some basic funding for incidental items.

We are Offering: land owners to be part of reactivating our inactive youth; provide the nursery for further bike champions; safe low risk community recreation; Lyttelton community and sponsors profile on the site and in media releases.

We Need Land: an empty section within the town area would be ideal.

Are you a land owner who can lend us a site to get this project underway?

We would not prevent you from rebuilding on your land when you are ready, but a temporary use of your site would help to bring another event to the Lyttelton community.

A Vulnerable Situation

Lyttelton Civil Defence Now Homeless

The closure of the Lyttelton Recreation Centre is another massive blow for the Lyttelton township. Ken Maynard, Lyttelton's Civil Defence Area Co-ordinator said "the township now doesn't have a Civil Defence Emergency Centre".

Civil Defence operated out of the Recreation Centre site and played a crucial role in the February emergency. Things seem to go from bad to worse for our dedicated team of Civil Defence volunteers.

Prior to the Recreation Centre being made out of bounds the Lyttelton Civil Defence team have also been struggling to get a generator. Luckily in February the Navy could loan one that they had. "We have a very vulnerable township if there are further events", Ken said.

Ken and others are questioning the entire closure of the Lyttelton Recreation Centre. The council issued media release only told half the story. Another internal document confirms that it is only Trinity Hall that is deemed non compliant with earthquake strengthening regulations at 29% of the building code. That being the case Ken and others wonder why the Squash meeting room, ordinary meeting room and offices can not remain open?

"The Lyttelton Recreation Centre has been open since February with the basketball and squash courts closed, surely Trinity Hall could just be added to that list" he said.

Whilst we agree that safety is paramount we know the remainder of the building is 89% compliant with the code. To ensure we have a Civil Defence Emergency Management base these rooms should remain open so that at the least Civil Defence Emergency Management could utilize the Meeting Room.

Roles and Responsibilities Explained

The Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority is responsible for leading and coordinating the ongoing recovery effort following the earthquakes of September 2010 and February 2011. This includes preparation of a Recovery Strategy for Greater Christchurch which identifies the following formal Recovery Plans and Programmes:

- Building Community Resilience Programme
- Built Heritage Recovery Plan*
- Central City Plan (CBD Recovery Plan)*
- Christchurch Demolition Programme
- Economic Recovery Plan*
- Education Renewal Recovery Plan*
- Effective Central Government Services Programme
- Finance and Funding Recovery Plan*
- Green Zone Land Remediation and House Repair/Rebuild Programme
- Iwi Māori Recovery Programme
- Land Building and Infrastructure Recovery Plan*
- Local neighbourhood plans and initiatives
- Seismic and Geotechnical research and investigation
- Sports, Recreation , Arts and Culture programmes
- Worst Affected Suburbs Programme

Recovery Plans must be consistent with the Recovery Strategy and inform regional and district policies, strategies, plans and programmes. Recovery Plans under the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Act need to be approved by the Minister for Canterbury Earthquake Recovery.

CERA is supporting a range of organisations in making well coordinated and timely decision making, to help restore the social, economic, cultural and environmental well-being of greater Christchurch communities. These organisations include the Christchurch City Council .

The Christchurch City Council's role is to provide good governance and promote the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of the city, including through the provision of services such as network infrastructure (ie: roads, water supply, solid waste collection and disposal) and community infrastructure (ie: libraries, recreational facilities) and the avoidance or mitigation of natural hazards.

The Christchurch City Council initiated a Suburban Centres Programme in June 2011 to assist the rebuild and recovery of the worst affected suburban commercial areas, including the preparation of a Master Plan for Lyttelton. This programme falls within the ambit of, and is consistent with, CERA's *Local neighbourhood plans and initiatives*. The suburban centre Master Plans are not Recovery Plans in the CERA sense, however.

Open Letter to Harbour Residents and Groups

Dated Tuesday 6th December 2011, Peter Davie, Chief Executive Lyttelton Port of Christchurch releases the following comments on another failure of the Te Awaparahi Bay reclamation containment system:

“ I am writing to express my regret at the failure on 12 November of our Te Awaparahi Bay reclamation containment system, which resulted in debris escaping to Harbour beaches. The boom broke due to extreme weather conditions, and major sea surges prevented the prompt reattachment of the broken sections.

My staff and I are committed to seeing this problem solved.

We are disappointed with the performance of the containment system, which according to the manufacturer was designed to cope with our local conditions. The manufacturer has gone back to the drawing board yet again and we are implementing further changes as quickly as possible.

We had already made a number of improvements, including the replacement of the original boom with a higher one. As well as improvements, we are also investigating the possibility of installing a second containment system outside the current one if needed.

Our beach cleanup programme continues to operate and crews are working around the Harbour and coastline to remove debris, along with other unrelated rubbish. We are grateful for the supportive comments for this programme that we have received from a number of residents.

Please don't hesitate to contact our Environmental Manager, Kim Kelleher, on 027 298 1347, or telephone our main Reception on 328 8198, should you notice any debris. We will ensure that it is quickly picked up.
