Lyttelton Sea Scouts

Celebrating 100 Years

The September 2010 Darfield earthquake meant that the Lyttelton Sea Scout centennial reunion celebrations were cancelled, but more than one year on and the club are determined to hold the event in Easter 2012 to coincide with the hosting of the National Sea Scout Regatta in Lyttelton. The cancellation has created an awesome outcome for reunion attendees as they will also be able to participate in rowing and sailing races as was the case in their youth.

More than 400 sea scouts from all over New Zealand are expected to descend on Lyttelton in Easter 2012 to compete in their National Sea Scout Regatta so it's really fitting to also hold Lyttelton's Centennial Re-union alongside this regatta.


Given Lyttelton's extensive history since arrival of the first four ships it should be of no surprise that Lyttelton Sea Scouts will celebrate 100 Years of Scouting. The earliest evidence/record of Lyttelton Sea scouts goes to back to 26th November 1910 the day Captain Scott departed our harbour on his ill fated expedition to Antarctic. Lyttelton Sea Scouts boarded the Beecroft [large Italian sailing vessel] to escort the "Terra Nova" as she left Lyttelton in the same way our pleasure craft of today see off visiting Cruise Ships.

In 1911 the Dominion Scout Newsletter summarised a day trek from Sumner Road to Taylor's Mistake with their mission to catch rabbits on the way for a hearty stew at their destination. After food and a few minutes devoted to the cooling of their well drilled feet they returned to Lyttelton reaching the Fire Station at 9-00pm. At this point of time over sixty scouts made up the troop numbers so was very well established. On the 7th March 1931 both the cubs and scouts attended the visit of Lord and Lady Baden-Powell and presented a demonstration of knotting and sideshow on the work of fireman. So the history began from 1910 and after ten decades we have achieved 100 Years.

Many Lyttelton families over many years have been associated to Lyttelton Sea Scouts be it as a cub, scout, venturer, leader or committee member. Indeed the troop attracted some of our friends from over the hill and across the harbour. What makes us different from usual scouting is the opportunity for our youth to learn about seamanship, rowing, sailing in addition to camping, hiking and all the other fun activities scouting provides.

Throughout the sixties, seventies and eighties the Lyttelton group was very well supported with two cub packs [Cressy and Randolph) and over fifty scouts. During this period sea scouting was strong in Canterbury with other troops like Pegasus, Mt Pleasant, Diamond Harbour and Akaroa boasting record numbers.

This meant stiff competition at annual Easter regattas when sea scout troops would vigorously compete on the water in a number of rowing and sailing races along with traditional camping competition.

Lyttelton Sea Scouts

Celebrating 100 Years

Lyttelton was the first sea scout group in New Zealand to purchase and construct a fibre glass sea scout cutter and was launched under the name of "Terranova" [Number 123] some thirty five years ago. This boat had a significant positive impact to New Zealand Sea Scouting for many troops went about replacing their old wooden cutters. Meantime "Terranova" produced some stunning results at the annual Easter Regatta. Her name is special to Lyttelton given her pedigree to Scott and the Antarctica history. She is still going strong even today after all these years. On 15th February 2010 our newest sea scout cutter [Number 287] was blessed by Father Denis of St Joseph's then launched by Ruth Dyson MP as the "Lyttelton". With the addition of Number 287 Lyttelton Sea Scouts now have three sea scout cutters that can be either rowed or sailed.

Many will remember the old scout den located next to the Banks Peninsula Yacht Club [since removed], adjacent to Sinclair Melbourne workshops, close to Fishermans Wharf. While the den was relatively small it was sufficient in providing basic facilities to operate a sea scout troop. Again during the fifties to eighties many sea scouts entered the old cracked door for the first time. Likewise one of our boatsheds was located 50 metres down the road from top of the inner harbour slipway and we later relocated to the "Taj Mahal" which is also gone replaced by Lyttelton Engineering workshop next to dry dock.

In 1990 the troop moved into their current premises purpose built with scout den on first floor and boats located on ground floor. Back then this was a huge community project with many sponsors, volunteers all getting in behind to ensure such a massive project came to fruition. So there will be many fond memories of being a cub, scout, venturer, leader or supporter of Lyttelton Sea Scouts Group with so many wonderful people who have been part of sea scouting in Lyttelton.

Eighteen months ago the Lyttelton Sea Scouts formed a re-union committee with mostly twenty passionate past members who want to ensure this special event is a great success. They intend to hold the 100 Years Re-union between Thursday 5th April 2012 to Saturday 7th April 2012 (Easter Weekend) alongside the 2012 National Sea Scout Regatta. The enthusiastic committee over many months has made all the arrangements for this special weekend and now invites all past members and anyone connected to Lyttelton Sea Scouts to contact us today to register your attendance.

Programme will include a "Meet & Greet" on the Thursday night at the Naval Point Yacht Club, Centennial Regatta Day on Friday including rowing and sailing races for all attendees who want to try their hand again finished with a combined dinner and "Gang Show" with the National Regatta in a huge marquee on the recreation ground.

The club has received fantastic support from the business community including their major sponsor Lyttelton Port of Christchurch supported by Stark Bros Limited, Mondo Vino Liquor Centre and Pegasus Bay Fishing. The committee sincerely thanks the partners who committed without hesitation thereby acknowledging the significance of this milestone for the quake battered community, Lyttelton.

Locals Engage Council for Solutions

A team of Lyttelton residents, lead by Sue French, are engaging with the Christchurch City Council to get the Lyttelton pool opened sooner rather than later. On Thursday March 15th Sue went to the City Council and presented information to the council's earthquake issues meeting. The information below is excerpts from the "Lets Open Lyttelton Pool" website posting:

Today Ian Whitehead, who's the southern area manager for recreation and sport, informed the group that the pool's DEA, or Detailed Engineering Assessment, will start on 20 May of this year and will take about a month. From this assessment will come three reports: a "qualitative report" covering what is wrong; a "quantitative report" detailing how to repair; and a geotechnical assessment of the land stability.

Ian highlighted that the main concern with the pool is around the south wall of the pool plus some lateral spreading around the changing rooms.

When the report is completed, Ian has said that he will be happy to come out and talk to the community about its outcomes. Factors council will consider when deciding the outcome of the pool re-opening are the costs of repair, the level of insurance cover as well as the importance of the pool to the community. Pro active community support for the pool has certainly been demonstrated by today's delegation.

Recreation Centre Update

Ian also updated the group on the progress on the Recreation Centre. The Detail Engineering Assessment for that building has been carried out and the recommendations have been made. Trinity Hall, part of the building [where yoga classes were held, amongst other things] is not too badly damaged and repairs will begin soon. He was hopeful that Trinity Hall would be reopened in two to four months, and he is pushing for two. This is great news!

The newer part of the building [the basketball and squash courts] has sustained higher levels of damage and will remain closed for a longer period of time - no timeline on that yet. There are also some concerns with the Winchester Street retaining wall and investigations are continuing.

Lyttelton Retaining Walls

SCIRT Community Meeting

There was a good turn out from our community to the SCIRT (Stronger Christchurch Infrastructure Rebuild Team) update public meetings on retaining walls in Lyttelton last week. Various presenters from the groups consortium partners informed us what was happening, and we were told that there are currently over 100 council owned walls that have been identified with damage in the Lyttelton area.

Work for the walls is being prioritised based on multiple criteria. These include things such as how critical the wall is in the provision of essential services, can the job be done more efficiently when something else is being repaired, what is the importance of the road that the wall is on, for example access to healthcare, schools, etc.


You may know that work has already begun on two retaining walls in the township, Cunningham Terrace and Sumner Road. Within the next three months work should also begin on walls in Canterbury and Ripon streets followed soon after by walls in London Street, St David's Street and Ticehurst Road, followed by Selwyn Road and Ross Terrace toward the end of 2012. As walls are prioritised construction schedules will be provided to the community.

The time frame for fixing the council owned walls in Lyttelton is at least five years. Some walls will take many months to build and others will be a short time frame. Walls will be constructed with various materials. The original red rock walls will be replaced with concrete retaining walls that have provision to be faced with the old red rocks at a later date. Other walls may be made of wood. As each wall is unique there may be a variety of methods used for construction.

The new walls will be well anchored so that they are more robust then the walls they replace, which may involve drilling into your land. Contractors will be seeking consent and easements from the property owners affected.

During this rebuild process as residents we can expect many temporary road closures, parking changes, dust, noise, possible vibrations, easement requests and heavy vehicle movements. Storage is a big issue for the teams, so if you have a spare section that could be used the team is eager to hear from you.

SCIRT appears to have a very good communications process to notify us when works are due and to keep us updated in general. If your home will be affected you will receive a letter outlining the detailed works and what the impact will be on you. You will be asked for works consent if the work impacts directly on your property.

Retaining Wall Q & A

Discussion from Last Weeks Meeting

Q "Will the walls all have different appearances?"

A "Yes, existing red stone walls will have provision for red rock, others will depend on the material used for construction.

Q " Will there be opportunities for betterment"?"

A "It is possible but only if approved by council and cost effective"

Q" Do you have a map that shows all the council owned walls"?"

A "Not yet. We are still scoping all the walls". Later answer " We will provide maps when we know all the information".

Q "How can we share local information with you"?"

A "Contact our team directly"

Q: "Who owns the retaining wall"

A: There was consensus that if the council has made a cutting to enable a road to be built then the wall to hold up the cutting is a council wall. It was not so clear for properties on the down side of the road. If the wall is to enable private access to a property the team said the wall is the responsibility of the home owner however, but walls will be assessed on a case by case basis as ownership isn't clear in some cases.

Co-owner Andrew Bishop told The Press last month that it had been a long time coming, but he was looking forward to things getting "back to normal". "We will be open on Friday, March 30 at 5pm. We're planning on another grand opening party, we've had enough practise at reopening to know how to do it now," Andrew says.

The grand opening celebrations will start on Friday 30th March, with The Eastern Family, Lindon Puffin and Runaround Sue. On the Saturday night you can head along to listen to Delaney Davidson and the Unfaithful Ways. And on Sunday, Leon is planning a cross-dressing extravaganza.

Because of damage to the access area, the venue was closed after the June 13 sequence of earthquakes, and it had been less than six weeks since the venue reopened after closing following the February quake. The battle to get the venue up and running again had been frustrating at times, Bishop has been quoted as saying "it never crossed my mind to give up" and that he and partner Deb Coupland were always determined to "go another round, and we've been pretty determined right from the start that The Wunderbar will live again."

A business recovery seminar was held as a joint initiative between the Lyttelton Harbour Business Association and Christchurch City Council on 15 February 2012. The purpose of the seminar was to provide sufficient and relevant information to business and commercial property owners to both enable them to progress their repairs or rebuilds and get good outcomes for the community.

Topics included business assistance, insurance, building demolition, development economics, collaborative rebuilding, heritage and green buildings, planning and building compliance, infrastructure repair/rebuild and certain Draft Lyttelton Master Plan actions which have business implications. Speakers included relevant representatives from Recover Canterbury, the Insurance Council, CERA and the Council. A simultaneous display of graphic and/or written information manned by the above presenters when they were not speaking and were available to talk to attendees on a one to one basis.

Corsair Bay Pirates


Success, Fun and Enthusiasm

For some projects we just act as an umbrella for residents, The Pirates of Corsair Bay is a good example of this and in other instances we actually run the activity. We are all about creating a culture of possibility and if any local residents have a project that helps to create a vibrant and sustainable township we'll give you the space to get there.

The formal part of the organisation comprises its volunteer Board. Margaret Jefferies is the Chair, Rico Humphreys the Secretary, Wendy Everingham the Treasurer, and the Board Members are Jodi Rees, Andrew Turner, Glen Harris, Vilma Loader, Ruth Targus and Bettina Evans. Like most organisations this team sets the direction of the organisation but in many instances Board Members are champions for various projects.

Lyttelton general community connects in many ways. Some people are paid up members and contribute \$10 a year via a subscription. Others participate in projects in an informal capacity or for example by being members of the Time bank or being on advisory groups associated with each project. We don't have a policy of everyone being a formal paid up member.

Another layer of our organisation is the staff and project contractors We are fortunate enough to have enough donors and revenue streams to support paid roles. Many of you will be familiar with Sue-Ellen Sandilands who works as our Administrator Tuesday to Friday.. Lottie Harris is our part time Manager, we also have three part time Time bank staff/contractors, Bettina Evans, Jen Kennix and Lisa Cardosi, plus two part time project workers Brian Rick and Nina Srot who work on the Harbour Resilience Project. Other contract roles include Lynnette Baird as the Manager of the Farmers Market and Andrew Turner the Event Organiser for the Festival of Lights.

Activities that we have initiated/run include the Lyttelton Community Garden, Lyttelton Farmers Market, Lyttelton Time Bank, Lyttelton Harbour Festival of Lights, Festival of Walking, Welcome Bags, Plenty to Share, LIFT Library, Lyttelton News insert in the Akaroa Mail, facilitating the Lyttelton Garage Sales and so the list goes on.

The Board meets monthly on the second Thursday of the month at 7pm at our community centre called "The Portal" at 54a Oxford St Lyttelton. This is an open meeting so you are welcome to drop in.
