Maintenance dredging of Cashin Quay 1 berth pocket to return it back to its pre-earthquake levels will commence today Friday 05 October.

Two methods were investigated and the chosen option is a crawler crane with a clam shell mounted on a barge to perform the work.

The team are working around shipping schedules and It is envisaged that this will take ten days to complete. They will work 12 hours per day until completed.

An Idea About Combined Research

Project Lyttelton in recent years has attracted a lot of interest from researchers. The range of the level of research has been wide. As a result, about a year ago the Project Lyttelton Board decided that I would follow up and get some guidelines onto our website so that potential researchers could be self-filtering. The people I approached to help me with this task had other things happening in their lives and so this idea slipped down my list of priorities.

However, recently I spent some time with Marjo Lips Wiersma from the Management Department at Canterbury talking about this issue. Marjo is a Lyttelton resident. Out of that discussion came three points:

- 1. Different projects can be linked to each other where useful for research purposes
- 2. Project Lyttelton could more proactively invite research that would forward its aims rather than accepting or not research offers that come in
- 3. People who are about to do or who have done research co-create a plan with PL about how they will disseminate their research so it benefits the community and Project Lyttelton as well as their own "careers".

The idea of a Research Day was mooted. We discussed the important role that research can play in the development of an organisation, business or community. We realised that if a wide range of organisations/businesses/community groups came together we could take a big picture view and see what we need to have researched within this whole community. More of a planned approach. I have noticed since the earthquake there is much duplication of research which is inefficient. I think it is better that as a collective we work out what we need to know and advertise that need amongst the research community.

So I am sending this message to as wide a group as I can think of -organisations, businesses and community groups - to see what other people's responses are to the idea of collectively working out what research we need. This could possibly be done via a Research Day. Generally how we work in Project Lyttelton is that if an idea fits within our vision statement – and this does AND we have a champion to run with this then we go ahead. We have the idea which fits the vision, but I am not the person who would/could champion the project.

I know that research has the potential to unlock amazing innovative developments. Are you attracted to the idea of getting our big picture clear and then identifying all that we want researched? Please let me know what you think. Feel free to pass this message on to others. I'll give you a couple of weeks to think about this idea and get back to me.

Port Hills Geotech Seminar

Just a quick reminder that the Christchurch City Council is working with the University of Canterbury and GNS Science to present a geotechnical information seminar next Saturday 13 October 2012 from 9.00am.

This is to help explain the complex and technical information in the GNS Science reports which were prepared for the Council in response to the Canterbury earthquakes and contain information on the life-safety risks from rock fall or boulder roll and cliff collapse on the Port Hills.

Details of the day are being finalised and will be sent through to us on Tuesday 9 October 2012. The seminar will be held at the University of Canterbury and you will need to register for the sessions, either online [details to be announced on 9 October 2012] or by phoning the Christchurch City Council on 941 8999.

It is important to understand the sessions are about explaining the information contained within the reports to help understand the science behind the life-safety risks from rock fall or boulder roll and cliff collapse on the Port Hills. The sessions will not cover the CERA zoning decisions or review, the criteria for the placement of section 124 notices or options for mitigation.

New Zealand Red Cross is presenting a series of talks by consultant psychologist Rob Gordon who has more than 25 years' experience from more than 30 disasters in Australia and New Zealand. Dr Gordon has provided support to bereaved family members from Port Arthur, The Bali bombings, the Asian tsunami, Black Saturday bushfires, cyclones Larry and Yasi, and the Queensland and Victorian floods of 2011-2012. Combining research findings and his extensive experience working with survivors of bushfires, cyclones, road accidents, terrorist attacks and other traumatic experiences, Rob Gordon has developed a specialist understanding of how to work effectively with people affected by mass trauma. "After I heard Rob talk on the radio for five minutes I felt I understood more what was happening to me, and I felt as though I would be able to get through this." "When Rob described the stress of recovery it was as if he was inside my head looking at what was going on."
